FEAST OF THE BIRTH OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST



St. John the Baptist is a major figure in the history of salvation. While in his mother's womb, he recognized the Saviour, his birth was accompanied by great signs; he retired to the desert where he led a life of austerity and penance. Devotion to St. John the Baptist has been present in the Christian Church since ancient times. In addition to the celebration of his death (29 August), of all the Saints he is the only one (besides Jesus and Mary) whose birth is also celebrated. He is the patron saint of those condemned to death or who have been imprisoned for the witness to the faith.

RE-OPENING OF OUR PARISH CHURCH

You may have heard that the Quebec government has authorized the reopening of places of worship as of June 22, now permitting public gatherings of up to 50 people.

In addition, we have recently received guidelines from the Archdiocese regarding the steps to be taken in order to reopen our church in a safe, secure manner through different phases.

Like all parishes, we face our own challenges and need to adopt our own timeline for welcoming parishioners back, while respecting the guidelines. Be assured that our first priority will be to ensure your personal safety by implementing the necessary health and security measures. At this stage, our deconfinement team is accessing how to implement the safety guidelines in keeping up with the needs, resources and character of our parish.

We are in **need of lots of volunteers** for the different phases of reopening of the church. Those willing to volunteer between the **ages of 18 and 65, in good health** and no respiratory issues, please contact the parish office either through email or phone calls. Training will be provided prior to reopening.

Though the church is still closed, be assured that we will make every effort to keep you informed of our plan of reopening, using the communication means available to our parish such as emails, Facebook, announcement during live streaming of The Mass on YouTube.
